

Charité Berlin

The Charité is the institution of the unified medical schools and hospitals of the Humboldt and Free University Berlin.

Charité has grown steadily in the course of its almost 300-year history. Since 2003 it is the largest school of medicine and university hospital system in Europe. All research results, applications and inventions in the life sciences target the well-being of patients.

The Charité employs nearly 14,000 staff and has around 6,000 medical students, 890 dental students, 440 nursing students and 8 different postgraduate programmes. Over 200 students go abroad every year on different exchange programmes (Erasmus, Unibrat, BMEP, Go East etc.). A similar number of students are coming to Berlin and the interest is still increasing.

The Charité will always contribute to new discoveries and has a particular interest in Gender medicine with one of the first institutes in Europe. The Charité particularly excels in e-learning programmes.
